PAC Committees 2025-2026

Site Safety Committee:

Liaise with the school to educate families about emergency & safety protocols. Connect with the City of Delta if there are traffic concerns. Identify safety or hazards on the school site. Work with the school to maintain the emergency bin contents.

Accessibility & Inclusion Committee:

Work alongside the school to ensure all students, regardless of accessibility or learning style have access to resources in the school community. Provide supports and resources for families to navigate educational challenges. Connect with others in the community & PAC from local schools.

Fundraising & Events Committee:

Work with the school to identify funding needs. Clearly outline and articulate objectives to parent community. Provide opportunities for families to connect. Plan, organize & facilitate events such as carnival, after school events & BBQ. Connect with local businesses and resources to secure donations and sponsorships.

IB Vision Committee:

Bring the school community together focused on an IB World view, to become acive, compassionate & lifelong learners. Working with other parents to educate and create awareness of the IB Learner Profile. Work closely with Teachers or classroom parent coordinators.

Promotions & Welcoming Committee:

Enhance school spirit and focus on creating a welcoming network for new families. Develop PAC newsletters & oversee digital content. Support in event recruitment.

Organize & facilitate hot lunch program. Maintain hot lunch platform & schedule, including payment & order forms. Recruit parents for distribution. Work directly with the school to establish dates, drop & distribution times. Organize payments



PAC Executive Team Roles & Responsibilities

Chair

- Preside over all membership, special, and executive meetings
 Prepare and present meeting agendas with input from school staff/administration
- Appoint committees as authorized
- Maintain email/phone list of executive and committee members
- Send PAC activity updates twice a year (January and June)
- · Act as one of the four signing officers
- Submit an annual report
- · Ensure actions align with PAC objectives
- · Serve as the official spokesperson

Co-Chair

- · Take on Chair's duties in their absence
- · Act as one of the four signing officers
- Take on extra duties as needed

Secretary/Communications

- Prepare and circulate meeting minutes within one week
- Manage PAC correspondence to the school community (emails, flyers, etc.)

Treasurer

- · Manage and report on PAC finances
- · Act as one of the four signing officers
- · Prepare annual budget and spending plan with Executive
- Complete annual gaming fund application by June 30
- Maintain accurate financial records
- Pay approved bills and expenses
- Manage two accounts: general and gaming (Envision Credit Union Tsawwassen)
- Deposit all PAC funds and handle float money for fundraisers
- Perform monthly bank reconciliations
- Report at each PAC meeting
- Submit year-end treasurer report (final copy after summer statements reconciled)

DPAC Representative

- · Attend monthly DPAC meetings on behalf of the PAC
- Report to PAC and Executive on DPAC matters
- Seek PAC input when required
- Distribute DPAC communications (newsletters, announcements, etc.)

Members at Large

- Attend PAC and Executive meetings
- · Assist with events, fundraising, newsletters, and committees
- Provide general support to the Executive
